



DISABLED FACILITIES

Central Hall Westminster opened in the 1912 and as with many similar buildings of the period, accessibility was not high on the architects' list of priorities. However, we have made a number of changes and improvements. Please contact a member of our staff if you require assistance at any time, during your visit.

Access

Low-level doorbells are situated outside the front entrance and at the Tothill Street side entrance.

There is ramped access at the Tothill Street door and then flat level access along the ground floor to the large lift. This travels to all floors where flat level access is available at most meeting rooms.

On the first floor, a stair lift provides access to the Lecture Hall and Library. Please ring low-level bell for assistance at either level.

Although the Media Room can be accessed via the smaller lift, this is not an officially designated route for wheelchair users due to the size of the lift.

Our City Council license requires patrons in wheelchairs to be accompanied by an escort.

Seats

In the Great Hall there are four wheelchair spaces marked in Row W (the back row) of the Stalls (third floor). There are no accessible seat positions in the Balcony (fourth floor) at present.

In the Café and all other rooms the seating is more flexible and chairs can be moved to provide spaces for wheelchair users.

Audio

There is an induction loop system in the stalls area (lower section) of the Great Hall. Please turn the switch on your hearing aid to "T".

Toilets

Accessible toilets are available at the basement level and on the third floor.

Assistance Dogs

Assistance dogs are welcome at Central Hall Westminster.
